Title of proclamation National Diaper Need Awareness Week 2018

Purpose of proclamation As the executive director of your local diaper bank, Eastside Baby Corner (EBC), I am writing to request that you proclaim September 24 – 30, 2018 as Diaper Need Awareness Week in Pierce County, and take part in the growing national movement, now in its sixth year! By issuing a proclamation, you will inform our fellow residents that 1 in 3 families cannot afford diapers for their children, and call on communities to support diaper banks like ours as we work together to help families obtain the diapers needed to keep all babies clean, dry and healthy. EBC is among the more than 300 community-based organizations that are members of the National Diaper Bank Network (NDBN). Last year, diaper banks in the National Diaper Bank Network secured similar proclamations from the governors or state legislatures in 31 states as well as from mayors and county officials in 181 cities and counties representing 38 states throughout the country. Thank you for your leadership in recognizing this need with your proclamation last year. Although we have made great progress this past year by distributing 955,878 diapers to struggling families, diaper need remains a chronic condition for many in our community. In conjunction with Diaper Need Awareness Week, individual diaper banks across the country are working with local and state governments to raise awareness of the issue, and planning events to rally sustainable support for diaper bank programs so we can continue helping parents access a most basic need for their children...clean diapers. Attached you will find background information about EBC, diaper need in Washington, and the National Diaper Bank Network, along with sample language that may be helpful in drafting the proclamation. We look forward to working with your office on this proclamation and in representing Pierce County in this national grassroots campaign. We would welcome the opportunity to accept the proclamation in person at your council meeting and speak to the need of kids and families in your community as well as EBC's impact. Official Statement

Whereas, Diaper Need, the condition of not having a sufficient supply of clean diapers to ensure that infants and toddlers are clean, healthy and dry, can adversely affect the health and welfare of infants, toddlers and their families; and

Whereas, national surveys report that one in three mothers experiencing diaper need at some time while their children are less than three years of age and forty-eight percent of families delay changing a diaper to extend their supply; and

Whereas, the average infant or toddler requires an average of at least 50 diaper changes per week over three years; and

Whereas, there are no government assistance programs for the purchase or provision of diapers, and a monthly supply of diapers can cost as much as six percent of a full-time minimum wage worker's salary, therefore obtaining a sufficient supply of diapers can cause economic hardship to families; and

Whereas, a supply of diapers is generally an eligibility requirement for infant and toddlers to participate in childcare programs and quality early education programs; and

Whereas, the people of [City/County] recognize that addressing Diaper Need can lead to economic opportunity for the state's low-income families and can lead to improved health for families and their communities; and

Whereas, [City/County] is proud to be home to various community organizations [alternatively, list state diaper banks] that recognize the importance of diapers in helping provide economic stability for families and distribute diapers to poor families through various channels; now
